Title 1 Required Information: As a parent of a student at Stukey Elementary, you have the right to know the professional qualifications of the classroom teacher who instructs your child. This is a requirement for all districts that receive Title I funds. Federal law allows you to request certain information about your student's classroom teacher. The law also requires the district to give you this information in a timely manner upon request. Listed below is the information about which you have the right to ask for regarding each of your student's classroom teachers.

• Whether the Colorado Department of Education has licensed or endorsed your student's teacher for the grades and subjects taught.

• Whether CDE has decided that your student's teacher can teach in a classroom without being licensed or qualified under state regulations because of special circumstances.

• The teacher's college major; whether the teacher has any advanced degrees, and, if so, the subject of the degrees.

• Whether any teachers' aides or similar para-educators provide services to your child and, if they do, their qualifications.

Classroom Corner

Kindergarten:

We are off to a great start in kindergarten! After setting a foundation of classroom routines, expectations, and building our community of learners, we have been diving into our academics! Please remember to read with your kindergartener each night and complete their monthly reading log. Also, please continue to complete and return the monthly homework at the end of each month. A huge thank you for remembering to check and return Friday folders. From numbers to letters and high frequency words to parts of a story, we are so excited for all of the ways your child will grow in the next few months!

1st Grade:

August has flown by and we are now in full swing with our school year. Your scholars are doing great with our first grade rituals and routines. During the September and October months, our literacy focus will be on a nonfiction genre themed around how plants and animals grow and change. In writing we will be practicing personal narratives and working towards writing procedural reports or How To's. In math we will begin our work with addition and subtraction including number stories. Our guided reading rotations will be up and running and your scholars will be working hard in reading at their instructional level and independent level during these rotations. Social Studies will be centered around learning about the calendar and special holidays around the year.

2nd Grade:

We are so excited to start the new school year!! We are starting off strong with Personal Narrative writing where we can share a special time in our lives. In Math we are learning new games such as the Number Grid Game. Reading has been so much fun teaching us all about plants and animals in their habitats. We are also working on how to be a good friend and how to build a caring and inclusive classroom community!!

3rd Grade:

September- In Math, we are finishing our first unit that covers time, introduces multiplication, and revisits rounding, and we will begin our second unit about Number Stories and Array. In Reading, we have adopted a new curriculum, so once we finish the launch unit, we will work on our first informational unit about life science. Students will be bringing home a magazine type book with extra activities! In Writing, we will finish our Personal Narratives, and begin "Information Writing". Finally, in Science we will continue our life cycle unit, and toward the end of the month begin our first social studies unit titled "Our Democratic Community" October- We will finish all of the units we started in September, before moving on to new units. In Math, we will start Unit 3, where students will begin work with operations. In Reading, we will work on our second unit that is based in fiction, Ways Characters Shape Stories. In Writing, we will work on "Writing in Response to Reading Informational Texts", with a focus on comparing and contrasting topics. After finishing our Social Studies unit on "Our Democratic Community", we will jump to our second Science unit: "States of Matter." Here students will learn about the three major states: solid, liquid, and gas.

4th grade:.

Math - In math, we are focusing on place value, number stories, and rounding.

Reading - We've started our new reading curriculum and are focusing on learning routines - active listening, constructive conversations, and identifying author's purpose

Science/SS - We are working on primary and secondary sources, famous Colorado people, learning about the structure and function of the government

Writing - We are working on personal narratives currently and our next unit will be compare and contrast.

5th Grade:

5th Grade is excited to start this year off at a run. We will be preparing for our trip to Young Ameritowne in October by studying economics and banking during Social Studies. In Mathematics we are learning how to determine the Area of a 2D figure and the Volume of a 3D figure. The school has a new reading curriculum this year and will be beginning our first unit in September. Students have begun writing their personal narratives and will be refining these over the course of the next month. When we complete our Social Studies unit, our first science classes will be about states of matter and forces. We look forward to an awesome year. 5th Grade, Best Grade!
